





#### **2020 Covid19 Projected Financial Impact**

- As the potential impact of Covid19 became apparent in March 2020 we began the process of contingency budget planning with final contingency budgets being signed off by the Board in April 2020.
- The aim of these was to cut back on non-essential expenditure to maintain basic corporate operations to yearend and achieve as close to a balanced budget as possible given circumstances. This led to key actions such as...
  - Termination of all 3rd party programme support contracts
  - Cutting key programme budget investments
  - o Cutting additional investment in projects such as upgrade of GI membership system
  - o Placing a hold on the recruitment of additional staff planned
  - Cutting back on standard corporate expenditure where possible
  - o Registering for the government wage subsidy scheme
- As we approach the year-end there are still very many variables in play however the following impact is clear...
  - o €1.5million in membership revenues has been wiped off GI
  - We are presently tracking a 40% drop in membership from 2019
  - We are now looking at a 2020 year-end turnover of circa €1.8-€2million against the original 2020 budget of €3.5million
- We continue to liaise with Sport Ireland who understand the commercial nature of our sport is more open to Covin19 impact than others. We also await announcement of the Resilience Fund application submitted in September 2020.



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6. Appointment of Auditors for incoming financial year

In line with company law and as per best governance practice we are asking for the members approval for the Board, as advised by the Audit & Risk committee, to appoint the auditors and fix renumeration in-line with competitive market rates.

The Audit & Risk Committee consists of...

The A&R Committee is assisted in its business by the CEO and reports back/makes proposals to the Board for final decision/ratification.





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2020 Voting System Restructure Proposal



# Background

Following instruction from the Board the Governance Committee was tasked with developing a proposal for a 'fit-for-purpose' voting system suitable for the modern GI.

The committee met multiple times (virtually) between July – September 2020 with the proposal being presented to the Board and ratified for presentation to the members in November 2020. The committee consisted of the following...

- Ger Rellis (Committee Chair)
- Ruth Larragy (Board Member)
- Ciaran Gallagher (CEO)
- Sarah O'Shea (Lawyer & governance expert/consultant)





## Rationale

- The current system was designed for when our organisation was very small in membership and consisted of small voluntary run clubs only it does not reflect the reality of the modern GI membership landscape.
- As the current system is individually based there could be 1000+ attendees with voting rights eligible to attend. This would be potentially unworkable, particularly when it comes to managing Q&A sections of general meetings.
- A new club delegate based system will provide a consistent system for modern GI and one that is perfectly suited to virtual operation. It is also similar to the systems operated by most other sports in Ireland and those of our international governing bodies in addition to the OFI/IOC.
- The current system does not reflect the club network landscape and is open to disproportionate influence. As 78% of GI membership is owned 22% of the clubs it is only fair that the interests of each club are represented proportionally. A club delegate based system whereby voting is weighted will ensure this.





# Proposal

To change the current voting system for general meetings from an individual member based system to a club delegate based system whereby club voting is weighted according to the size of the club...

- Each club will be allowed max 2 x delegates which must be named via online registration process a min of 2 x weeks prior to a meeting with one being nominated as primary delegate (person who votes) and other secondary delegate (votes if first can't attend last min etc.).
- Voting is on behalf of the club as a member entity to represent the collective interests of the club as a whole. The club must complete the relevant process for approval of club voting position prior to the general meeting (e.g. all voting positions discussed and approved by club Board/Management Committee). Clubs must also confirm with GI via online registration process that they have completed this process when registering club delegates.
- Each club will vote once for each motion/resolution/Board position via primary delegate (secondary if primary not present) with the voting being weighted with 1 vote for every 100 members in the club (i.e. a club with 100 members is weighted as 1 vote and a club with 1000 members is weighted as 10 votes).
- A quorum shall be such number of delegates that make up 50% of votes
