
































Covid19 Impact – Gymnastics Ireland Turnover

Please Note - 2022 Forecast

- As of end of May 2022 we are on target to achieve a balanced budget assuming we retain min 24k members in-line with the new individual membership fees as communicated to clubs.
- This is also assuming programme activity is able to continue as planned to year end with no further Covid19 restrictions

Covid19 Recovery



- ✓ Clubs began to reopen from June 2021
- ✓ GI secured an additional €500k in club Covid19 Resilience Funding to support 17 clubs that applied
- ✓ GI also paid for 82% of club insurance costs in 2021 following negotiation of an €84k refund on insurance due to lockdown Jan June 2021
- ✓ In total during the pandemic GI secured €1.9 million in Covid19 Resilience Funding with €1.52 million for club support
- ✓ International events began to return to activity for all disciplines Q3/4 2021
- ✓ GI programme activity began to return with in person coaching courses & events in Q4 2021 with the rest of programme activity returning in 2022
- ✓ 4 x Club Check-in virtual meetings were held in early 2022. The purpose of these was to touch base with club network, also to brief clubs re Gl's financial position and the need to increase the annual membership fee to support post covid rebuild plus the impacts of inflation.

2 key sub-strategies underpinning the Strategic Plan 2021-2024





Since last AGM we have delivered the National Awards, 3 x National Series and 2 GymSTART events plus The floor following a 2 year break due to the pandemic

- Unfortunately we had to cancel 1 x GymSTART & 1 x National Series event due to financial viability however we are confident they will return in 2023
- In total 4800 gymnasts & 11,000 spectators have attended GI events since the last AGM
- We have invested €645k in events equipment utilising the unanticipated €250k surplus from 2020 in addition to a €395k Sports Capital Grant received. This covering...
 - Necessary equipment fixes and replacements following equipment being in storage for 2 years due to pandemic
 - Equipment additions needed to resource the events programme for next 5+ years including new Olympic Cycle equipment and a new Floor
 - The international competition podium as the last piece of major events infrastructure needed for our national programme and plans to host international events going forward

Events





Education

Our online eLearning system launched in July 2021 and has proven very accessible for members

Since the reopening of indoor Sport in Q3/4 2021 we have run a total of 18 courses catering for approx. 250 coaches across GymSTART & Discipline Specific with more planned throughout the summer/to year-end

We also developed and launched a new GymSTART Introductory module designed to act as a pathway into coaching for younger coaches/gymnasts aged 14+ and to date have run 7 modules catering to approx. 134 young coaches





Inclusion

GymABLE

• We successfully achieved funding to continue our investment in GymABLE for 2022. This will see investment to support the establishment of the programme in even more GI clubs while also funding further partnered research projects to evidence the benefits of the programme.

Women in Sport

 We are currently in the development stages of a new Women in Sport strategy which will focus on the retention and development of female teenagers in sport. In terms of the research input into this strategy we have partnered with UK based Working With Women in Sport (WWIS).



Other initiatives

 GI has engaged with a number of wider Sport Ireland inclusion initiatives including feeding into the recently launched SI 'Diversity & Inclusion in Sport' policy which focuses on provision for 3 key groups including LGBTI+, Disability and Ethnic Minorities.

Sport Ireland Tokyo Review

GI received a very positive review in the Sport Ireland Tokyo Games Cycle Review. The review praised the developments of GI's Performance system over the Tokyo cycle and recommended increased investment focussed on 3 key recommendations...

- 1. Invest in people and coaches that can help to capitalise on the strong structures of programme
- 2. Expand athlete support further across the national programme
- 3. Continue the rebuild from impact of COVID-19 to return NGB to previous levels A copy of the review can be downloaded by <u>clicking here...</u>

Sport Ireland High Performance Investment – Paris Cycle

Following on from the positive Tokyo cycle review GI secured the 2nd highest increase in HP funding in the Irish HP sport system with additional investment to be focussed on the 3 recommendations from the review. As a result...

- We have increased investment in our P&T staff/contractor team across coaching and technical experts
- 5 gymnasts are now receiving direct support funding through the SI carding programme (up from 2 gymnasts in the Tokyo cycle)
- We have significantly increased the Athlete Support Services programme provision through the Sport Ireland Institute with SII's Julie-Anne Ryan being appointed as our Head of Performance Services (HOPS). 10 Olympic programme gymnasts covering 3 disciplines are now receiving full institute service provision while we are building targeted educational programme elements covering the full range of athlete support service areas into the full squad programme.









Other Performance & Technical matters of note...

Competition

- Emma Slevin became Ireland's first All-Around Finalist at a Gymnastics World Championships, qualifying 21st and finishing in 19th in the finals.
- 1 x Gold & 2 x Bronze for our Men's gymnasts on the 2022 World Cup Circuit for Rhys McClenaghan (Pommel), Eamon Montgomery (Floor) & Adam Steele (Floor) respectively.
- Our Trampoline, Tumbling, Acro & Rhythmic gymnasts returned to international competition after a break of nearly 2 years.

National Squad

 Our National Squad programme also returned to normal operation in 2022 following a break of nearly 2 years

Performance Culture

• In partnership with Sport Ireland we will be engaging in the development of a new 'positive culture programme' that will be targeted at both the GI HP and club environments. This is being done to ensure we continue to develop our positive performance culture and assessing learning from some of the global culture issues that have hit our sport in other countries.







NATIONAL FOOTPRINT OF GYMNASTICS










Media engagement

GI continued to engage with media partners to maxamise coverage for international events including working with our partners in RTE re Tokyo games coverage in addition to ensuring good use of the 'free-to-air' deal between FIG/European Gymnastics & the European Broadcast Union.

Digital Comms

GI continues to have success in the context of our engagement with members and fans through digital/social media.

Our Tokyo 2020 pre, during and post games campaign led to GI ranking 1st in terms of engagement on Facebook out of all Irish sports organisations including the Olympic Federation of Ireland. We also regularly rank as among the top Irish sports in terms of engagement on Instagram, Twitter in addition to Facebook as reported monthly by independent social media tracking company Olytico.

This success is driven by investment in quality digital content focussed around GI events and programmes. Good recent examples of this are...

- GI Education Plan developed (mandatory) in conjunction with Sport Irl ADU
- GI website updated to reflect 2022 Prohibited List & 2022 AD "wallet card"
- AD information issued to all National Squad members
- 2022 AD Wallet Card emailed to every Club for distribution to coaches & gymnasts/parents
- Half-yearly AD report provided to Sport Ireland
- PWC Mngr completed the International Testing Agency "AD for International Federations" education module

Testing

- 2 gymnasts added to Sport Ireland Registered Testing Pool (RTP)
- Total now on the RTP = 4
- Out of competition testing continued for our RTP gymnasts
- As at, July 2022 6 tests conducted "out of competition"
- May 2022 Testing held at National Series Event 2 tests completed
- Test result letters issued by ADO



ANTI-DOPING REPORT 2022

- PWC Mngr communicates quarterly with RTP gymnasts regrading the responsibility to comply with 'Whereabouts' requirements
- Continuation of requirement for all FIG licence holders to complete new WADA education module
- Numerous queries on the taking of medications to PWC Mngr
- June 2022 Potential applications for Therapeutic Use Exemptions being considered
