• The Club Development Pathway is aimed at improving gymnasts' physical preparation and enhancing their basic skill acquisition

- Gymnasts will compete at the grade specified for their age
- Ages taken on the 1st January
- The minimum age to follow the Club Development pathway is 7 years old (6 on 1st January) in the year of competition. Gymnastics Ireland have introduced a Grade 0 which is the Grade 1 routines, but for gymnasts aged under 8 (i.e. 6 or 7 on 1st January in the year of competition)
- The specific equipment is detailed for each grade in the Club Development Grades book
- Each of the Grades has 7 routines, the 6 Men's apparatus, and a Physical Preparation Programme
- All 7 scores will count towards the final overall result
- Teams determined per grade
- Clubs may enter more than one team and / or individuals



(Out of Age) Grades Competition

This competition is designed for gymnasts who may not feel they are ready to compete within the In -Age Grade structure or are relatively new to men's competitive gymnastics. These gymnasts are allowed to compete at grades out of their specific age band.

- This competition is on the Club Development Grades
- Gymnasts enter the grade that suits their ability
- Gymnast may enter a lower grade than they competed in previous competitions (as the apparatus may prove more challenging)
- Ages taken on the 1st January
- Each of the grades have 7 routines; the 6 men's apparatus and a Physical Preparation Programme
- The best 5 scores only will count towards the final overall result (so gymnasts do not have to perform all 7 routines, but may do so if they wish)
- Clubs may enter more than one team and / or as many individuals as they wish
- Teams determined per grade
- Gymnasts will not be allowed to drop down a level the following year, but may stay at the same level if suitable
- Age groups may change subject to entries

Gymnasts who have competed in either the Elite Grades, Club Development Grades, U12 or U14 Voluntary Code, will NOT be eligible to compete in the (Out of Age) competition in that year. (Special circumstances may apply – in these cases, coaches must request permission from the Performance and Technical Manager). In the following year they will be allowed to compete if the Levels Competition occurs before the above competitions.

- 2001 born gymnasts can compete as either Junior or Senior in the National Championships
- The Under 12 and Under 14 Voluntary Competition rules can be found on the Gymnastics Ireland website
- Clubs may enter more than 1 team into the Junior and Senior Team Competition

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• Gymnasts must perform 2 salto vaults to be eligible for a vault final

Voluntary Under 12 / 14 Codes

The FIG Code of Points is used for all Gymnastic Ireland voluntary competitions in all age groups. ONLY the following exceptional amended rules apply. If there is no exception or amended rule listed here, then the published FIG Code rule applies.

Under 14 gymnasts are judged on the FIG Junior Code 2017-2020 with the following exceptions and amendments:

- Additional safety mats up to 30cm will be allowed as an option on request at High Bar, Rings and 10cm at Parallel Bars all without penalty
- Vault height 125cm
- Under 14 short routines deductions

Under 12 gymnasts will be judged on the FIG Junior code 2017-2020 with the following exceptions and amendments:

- Dismount requirements will be B = 0.5 and A = 0.3 (Code or Supplementary element list)
- Parallel Bar heights may be lowered to between 160cm and 180cm without penalty
- For Pommel Horse a springboard may be used to mount the apparatus without penalty. The coach will be responsible for removing the springboard from the working area after mount
- Additional safety mats up to 30cm will be available as an option on request at high bar, rings and 10cm on parallel bars all without penalty
- Vault height will be 120cm
- Shorts without socks may be used without penalty (teams must dress uniformly)
- At all Gymnastics Ireland under 12 competitions it is COMPULSORY for the coach to stand in during the Rings and High Bar routines
- Under 12 short routines deductions

Moving Between the Grades

- As stated, in the (In-Age) Grades Championships, gymnasts will only be allowed to compete at the grade specified for their age. Therefore, the following year the gymnast will move to the next grade
- Gymnasts scoring > 85% in the Club Development Grades should consider transferring to the Elite Pathway for the following year
- Gymnasts scoring < 70% in the Elite Grades should consider transferring to the Club Development Pathway for the following year
- Gymnasts do not need to pass a grade to move on to the next one the following year



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
