

AGE GROUPS

- For all competitions, age is determined on the 1st January of the year of competition. Gymnasts must be turning 7 in the year of competition.
- All gymnasts must compete within their respective age groups.
- If there are insufficient numbers in an age group, Gymnastics Ireland may reduce the age categories.
- At all times it is the coach's responsibility to ensure that gymnasts are entered into the correct Age Group / Level.

GENERAL

- Any gymnast can compete in the PLUS Levels pathway, however, all National Squad members & any gymnast who has competed in a FIG trial (including guests) MUST compete in the PLUS Levels pathway and NOT the General Levels pathway.
- Please refer to the National Competition & Events Policy re late entries / substitutions / reserve gymnasts / submission of Judges names etc.
- All equipment heights detailed herein are approximate.
- FIG Artistry, Composition & Specific Apparatus deductions and General Execution deductions will be applied at all levels, along with some additional "Levels only deductions" which are detailed in the NDP Routines Booklet Version 3 2020 Edition.
- The music for all competitions must be sent in MP3 format, when instructed to music@gymnasticsireland.com.
- A back-up copy of each gymnast's music must also be brought to the competition on a USB stick. Each club/coach should have the USB stick with them on the field of play, should there be a problem with the original copy.

JUDGES

- For all competitions, clubs who have 5 or less gymnasts competing during any one day, a minimum of 1 Judge is required for all sessions throughout the day of the competition.
- For clubs with up to **20** gymnasts competing in the one day, they are required to have **2** Judges for all sessions.
- For clubs with more than **20** gymnasts, **3** Judges will be required for all sessions on that day.





COMPETITION RULES GENERIC TO ALL COMPETITIONS

Team Composition

For **ALL** Gymnastic Ireland **WAG** Team Competitions:

- There is **no** limit to how many teams a club may enter in each level/age group.
- Each team can consist of a maximum of 5 and a minimum of 3 gymnasts per team.
- All 5 gymnasts may perform on each apparatus.
- The top 3 highest scores on each apparatus determine the Team total on the apparatus.
- The 4 apparatus totals determine the final team score.

All-Around Competition

- The All-around score will be the total of all 4 apparatus scores for all General Levels & FIG, and all 5 apparatus for the 'Plus' Levels. (Range routine being the 5th).
- A gymnast must compete on all apparatus for an 'All-around ranking'.
- The All-Around Championships is also the qualifier for Apparatus Championships. Therefore clubs can enter gymnasts on any number of apparatus to qualify to the NSSC (apparatus final).

Placings & Titles

- The **National All-around Champions** will be declared at the National Series All-around competitions in March & May 2019 in each age group and all levels including FIG. National medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd All-around placings in each age group and levels including FIG. (Except Level 1 where the All-around Championships are in June).
- The **National Apparatus Champions** will be declared at the 'National Series Super Championships' in June 2020 in each age group and all levels including FIG. National medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd placings on each apparatus in each age group and all levels including FIG. (Level 1 will be for the AA title).
- The **National Team Champions** will be declared at the 'National Series' Team competitions in November in each age group and all levels including FIG. (Except Level 1 this Team Title will be awarded in March). National medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd Team placings in each age group in all levels.
- 1st, 2nd & 3rd All-around placings in each competition of each level will be awarded at the 'Open All-around Competition' in November.
